

WERNER BERGES



Werner Berges (*1941 Cloppenburg, †2017 Freiburg i.B.) is a pioneer of German Pop Art, who already achieved fame in the nineteen-sixties and seventies. He now stands center stage in the rediscovery and renewed recognition of "German Pop" in the art world. His main theme—the female body—finds infinite multiplication and seriality in his oeuvre's enigmatic play of painted, cutout, and laminated circles, grids, stripes of color, and lines. The exhibition contains works from the sixties up to today, which in their differentiation of poses and silhouettes take women as a type to the brink of alienation with his eroticism from the world of goods, and question the utopia of beauty.










Werner Berges Lady, 1966 Mixed media on canvas 130 x 100 cm
